i) Roof Project	The Rufus Gibbs Trust Fund which is associated with the Ecclesiastical Province of BC have awarded a grant totaling \$5000 toward our roof project. The entire roof project has gone extremely well and has been broadly supported.	

ii) Upcoming AGM	<p>The 2017 AGM is scheduled for February 5, 2017. Preparation is underway: Template for reports will be coming out soon. Deadline to submit reports is Jan 8, 2017. iii) Hard of Hearing Component of the Sound System	<p>Moved/ Seconded Kathy Moore/ Rose Roy carried BE IT RESOLVED THAT: Based on the estimated quote of \$6500.00 the Hard of Hearing component of the sound system will be purchased and installed.</p> <p>Payment for this expense is as follows: \$2000 toward the cost was received from APCI, \$3000 was donated from the thrift store, and the final \$1500 will come from the Dean's discretionary fund.</p> <p>Upon installation, the system will be fully functional for up to 12 people. Gordon Dove reported on the recent workshop to try the system and shared that those who participated experienced a significant advantage and recommended purchase of the new equipment. Once the system is ordered, it will take approximately 4 weeks to arrive and will be fit right into the existing sound system. The batteries for the system are rechargeable and the system works in 2 ways, earphones can be worn that are effective with all hearing aids and newer hearing aids can be connected to the system without the addition of the earphones being worn.</p>
