



**Tuesday evenings, January 28 to February 18, 2020, 7PM to 8.30PM EST - \$80**

In the church and in society, the theme of reconciliation is often invoked: in conversations about settler and indigenous relations in Canada, about race relations in the United States, about politics, about the mission of Christians, and so much more. This non-credit online course explores the meaning and practice of reconciliation in the church and world in the 21st century.

Students will learn about different understandings of reconciliation, unique Christian perspectives on the topic, and how the idea can be used to shape Christian ministry and mission both locally and globally.
