Cost \$12/person

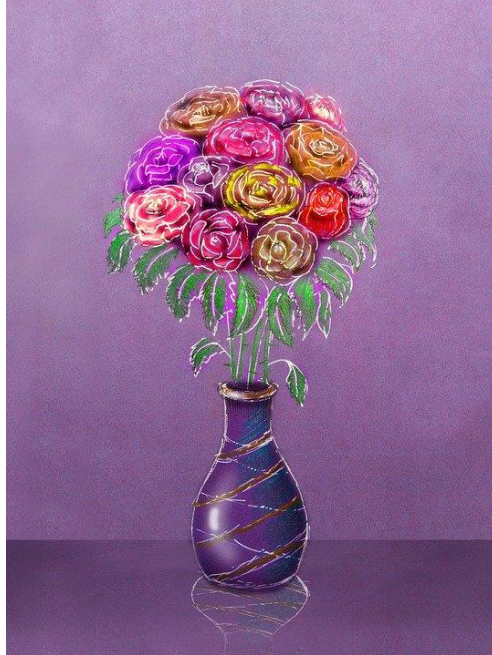
No minimum number and if we have more than 30 people, they will use a 2nd sleigh. If the snow is minimal, they can put wheels on the wagons.

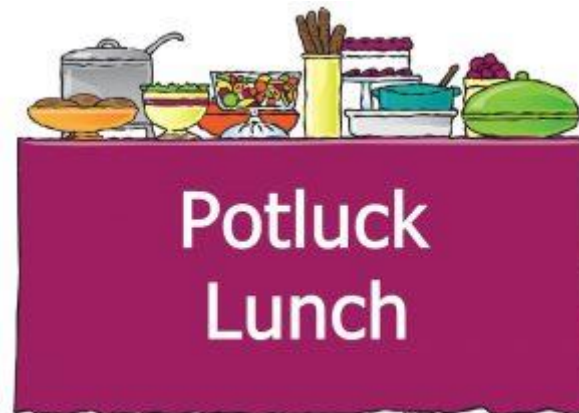
