Access is fairly simple, follow these instructions:

CONNECT ONLINE

Zoom may install a piece of software on your computer so you can connect. If you use Zoom already it is likely there now. Finally you should see your picture on the screen. Tell Zoom you would like to connect with Computer Audio and you will be able to speak and hear and see others.

CONNECT BY PHONE

If for any reason your cannot connect with video you can call in by phone.

When prompted enter the Meeting ID: 196 396 852

IGNORE THE REQUEST for participant number by pressing #

When prompted, enter the Password: 806044

EITHER WAY WE HOPE YOU CAN CONNECT WITH OTHERS NEXT TUESDAY AND/OR THURSDAY. The same link should work for all our coffee time meetings.
