MUSIC PROGRAM - Parish Ministries of St. Paul's Cathedral

The music program at St. Paul's Cathedral in Kamloops consists of the St. Paul's choir, soloists within the choir, occasional guest vocalists and instrumentalists from the community as well as all music - organ preludes and postludes, hymns and solos supporting the liturgy.

The group has shown outstanding leadership in enhancing the 10 AM services as well as other special occasions. Soloists have been ongoing and solo rehearsals and preparation have included many Fridays and Saturdays.

All service music, including organ preludes and postludes, as well as choir anthems, solos, and hymns are planned in accordance to the liturgy. The Dean and I met every Monday morning from September through to December 30, 2019 to coordinate the music and to plan at least six weeks ahead.

There has been considerable effort to expand our music team. Ivan Vutev, countertenor, Andrew Mercer from "Cod gone Wild", Jennifer Kane, flautist, Alexa and Damaris Ste Marie, guitarist Pedro Sequera, Ron Ste Marie, percussionist, Bishop Gordon Light, singer and guitarist, as well as soloists within the choir - Rhonda Dextraze, Jim Waldie, and Jim Mitchell have all been part of our team.

Our music program is an excellent way to become involved in our service, express our talents and meet others with similar interests.
