Introduction

Established in 1996, National Indigenous Peoples Day falls annually on June 21. Occurring this year on a Sunday, we have a great opportunity to participate and share knowledge about indigenous persons' values, customs, languages, and culture. Acknowledging the systemic racism across our land, we can in a timely manner repent and return to the Lord and to those we have injured.

Although the three Indigenous Peoples groups in Canada—First Nations, Inuit, and Métis—share many similarities, they each have their own distinct heritage, language, cultural practices, and spiritual beliefs. There is much diversity among these peoples. National Indigenous Persons Day provides an opportunity to acknowledge the unique and outstanding achievements and contributions of First Nations, Métis, and Inuit and to show pride in their accomplishments.

We are so grateful for the community of Anglicans who identify as indigenous in our Territory. We acknowledge their pain, and are inspired by their faith, resilience, wisdom and strength. Kukwstsetsemc

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THE HOLY GOSPEL OF OUR LORD JESUS CHRIST ACCORDING TO JOHN **Glory to You Lord Jesus Christ**

In the beginning was the Word, and the Word was with God, and the Word was God. He was in the beginning with God. All things came into being through him, and without him not one thing came into being. What has come into being 4 in him was life, and the life was the light of all people. The light shines in the darkness, and the darkness did not overcome it.

(John testified to him and cried out, "This was he of whom I said, 'He who comes after me ranks ahead of me because he was before me.'") From his fullness we have all received, grace upon grace.
