Dear Families,

As part of this Sunday's readings we read Psalm 13, a psalm where we hear the ever so familiar complaint: "how long?". When are times that you have asked "how long?"?

I think of long drives to exciting places, waiting for my turn, waiting for the end of the school day, waiting until I can see my friends again, and waiting for the cookies to finish baking in the oven!

Psalm 13 is a "how long" psalm... we hear the psalmist asking God how long bad stuff will last, asking God to help, and then we hear the beautiful reminder that God is with us and God's love is constant.

Consider reading this Psalm together as a family:

All: How long

Leader: will you forget me, LORD? Forever?

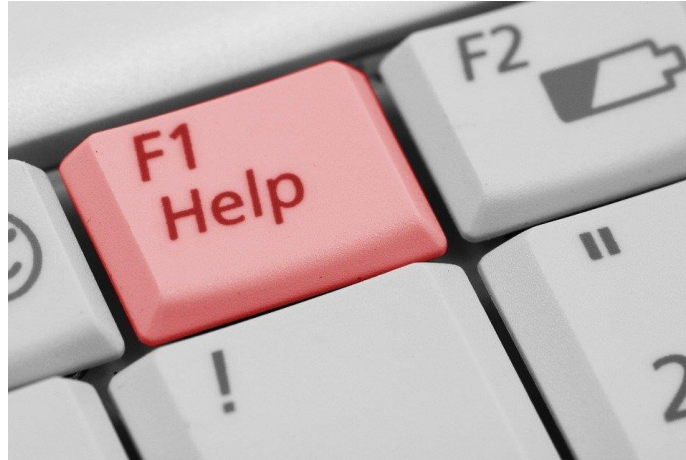
While most folks are approved for accessing the building, a few people still forget or may still be unaware to get advanced authorization (from Jon Buckle at 250 571-0675)
