Before small pox ravaged the area, there were 200 communities, and after smallpox less than 200 people survived. They all came together, and this is how Bella Coola was formed. Resiliency is in Christine's blood. She takes pride in being a strong Nuxalk woman and mother to her five beautiful children. Her children have given her the strength she needed to continue moving forward to pursue her dreams. Christine began her career in health care in 2002. She started as a Resident Care Aide and then furthered her education to become a Licensed Practical Nurse in 2008. She has been an LPN since 2009 and spent all these years working in Dementia Care at various nursing homes in Kamloops, BC. Christine has plans to further her education and become a Registered Nurse. Having 2 children living with mental illness and losing both her best friends to addictions has made her passionate about mental health and addictions. She is going to pursue that path and plans to work in mental health and/ or addictions after she is completed the Registered Nurse program.
