### **The Renewal of Baptismal Vows**

**Bishop** Let us give thanks to the Lord our God.

**People** It is right to give our thanks and praise.

**Bishop**

We thank you, Almighty God, for the gift of water. Over water the Holy Spirit moved in the beginning of creation. Through water you led the children of Israel out of their bondage in Egypt into the land of promise. In water your Son Jesus received the baptism of John and was anointed by the Holy Spirit as the Messiah, the Christ, to lead us, through his death and resurrection, from the bondage of sin into everlasting life.

We thank you, Father, for the water of baptism. In it we are buried with Christ in his death. By it we share in his resurrection. Through it we are reborn by the Holy Spirit. Therefore in joyful obedience to your Son, we celebrate our fellowship in him in faith.

We pray that all who have passed through the water of baptism may continue for ever in the risen life of Jesus Christ our Saviour.

To him, to you, and to the Holy Spirit, be all honour and glory, now and for ever. **Amen.**

Do you reaffirm your renunciation of evil and renew your commitment to Jesus Christ?

**People**

**I do.**

**Bishop**

Do you believe in God the Father?

**People**

**I believe in God, the Father almighty,  
creator of heaven and earth.**

**Bishop**

Do you believe in Jesus Christ, the Son of God?

**People**

**I believe in Jesus Christ, his only Son, our Lord. He was conceived by the power of the Holy Spirit and born of the Virgin Mary. He suffered under Pontius Pilate, was crucified, died, and was buried. He descended to the dead.**

On the third day he rose again.  
He ascended into heaven,  
and is seated at the right hand of the Father.  
He will come again  
to judge the living and the dead.

**Bishop** Do you believe in God the Holy Spirit?

**People** I believe in the Holy Spirit, the holy catholic Church, the communion of saints, the forgiveness of sins, the resurrection of the body, and the life everlasting.

**Bishop** Will you continue in the apostles' teaching and fellowship, in the breaking of bread, and in the prayers?

**People** I will, with God's help.

**Bishop** Will you persevere in resisting evil and, whenever you fall into sin, repent and return to the Lord?

**People** I will, with God's help.

**Bishop** Will you proclaim by word and example the good news of God in Christ?

**People** I will, with God's help.

**Bishop** Will you seek and serve Christ in all persons, loving your neighbour as yourself?

**People** I will, with God's help.

**Bishop** Will you strive for justice and peace among all people, and respect the dignity of every human being?

**People** I will, with God's help.

**Bishop** God the creator, the rock of our salvation,  
has given us new birth by water and the Holy Spirit, and bestowed  
upon us the forgiveness of sins, through our Lord Jesus Christ. May  
he keep us faithful to our calling,  
now and for ever. **Amen.**

## **The Presentation**

**A priest and a lay person, and additional presenters if desired, standing before the bishop, present the ordinand, saying,**

**Presenters** Lynne, bishop in the Church of God, on behalf of the clergy and people of the Territory of the People, we present you Linda to be ordained a priest in Christ's holy catholic Church.

**Bishop** Has she been selected in accordance with the canons and customs of this Church? And do you believe her manner of life to be suitable to the exercise of this ministry?

**Presenters** We certify to you that she has been duly selected, and we believe her to be qualified for this order.

**The bishop says to the ordinand,**

Will you be loyal to the doctrine, discipline, and worship of Christ as this Church has received them? And will you, in accordance with the canons of this Church, obey your bishop and other ministers who may have authority over you and your work?

**The ordinand answers,**

I am willing and ready to do so; and I solemnly declare that I do believe the holy scriptures of the Old and New Testaments to be the word of God, and to contain all things necessary to salvation; and I do solemnly promise to conform to the doctrine, discipline, and worship of the Anglican Church of Canada.

**The ordinand then signs the above declaration in the sight of all present.**

**All stand. The bishop says to the people,**

Dear friends in Christ, you know the importance of this ministry, and the weight of your responsibility in presenting Linda for ordination to the sacred priesthood. Therefore, if any of you know any impediment or crime for which we should not proceed, come forward now, and make it known.

**If no objection is made, the bishop continues,**

**Bishop** Is it your will that Linda be ordained a priest?

**People** It is.

**Bishop** Will you uphold her in this ministry?

**People** We will.

### **The Examination**

All now sit except the ordinand, who stands before the bishop. The bishop addresses the ordinand as follows:

Linda, the Church is the family of God, the body of Christ, and the temple of the Holy Spirit. All baptized people are called to make Christ known as Saviour and Lord, and to share in the renewing of his world. Now you are called to work as a pastor, priest, and teacher, together with your bishop and fellow presbyters, and to take your share in the councils of the Church.

As a priest, it will be your task to proclaim by word and deed the gospel of Jesus Christ, and to fashion your life in accordance with its precepts. You are to love and serve the people among whom you work, caring alike for young and old, strong and weak, rich and poor. You are to preach, to declare God's forgiveness to penitent sinners, to pronounce God's blessing, to preside at the administration of holy baptism and at the celebration of the mysteries of Christ's body and blood, and to perform the other ministrations entrusted to you.

In all you do, you are to nourish Christ's people from the riches of his grace, and strengthen them to glorify God in this life and in the life to come.

Do you believe you are truly called by God and his Church to this priesthood?

**Answer** I believe I am so called.

**Bishop** Do you now in the presence of the Church commit yourself to this trust and responsibility?

**Answer** I do.

**Bishop** Will you respect and be guided by the pastoral direction and leadership of your bishop?

**Answer** I will.

**Bishop** Will you be diligent in the reading and study of the Holy Scriptures, and in seeking the knowledge of such things as may make you a stronger and more able minister of Christ?

**Answer** I will.

**Bishop** Will you endeavour so to minister the word of God and the sacraments of the new covenant, that the reconciling love of Christ may be known and received?

**Answer** I will.

**Bishop** Will you undertake to be a faithful pastor to all whom you are called to serve, labouring together with them and with your fellow ministers to build up the family of God?

**Answer** I will.

**Bishop** Will you do your best to pattern your life (and that of your family) in accordance with the teachings of Christ, so that you may be a wholesome example to your people?

**Answer** I will.

**Bishop** Will you persevere in prayer, both in public and in private, asking God's grace, both for yourself and for others, and offering all your labours to God, through the mediation of Jesus Christ, and in the sanctification of the Holy Spirit?

**Answer** I will.

**Bishop** May the Lord who has given you the will to do these things give you the grace and power to perform them.

**Answer** Amen.

In peace let us pray to the Lord.

Invocation: CP #637, Come, Holy Ghost, Our Souls Inspire

**The bishop stands with the priests who assist her, the ordinand kneeling before her; she stretches out her hands toward her, and begins this Prayer of Consecration.**

We praise and glorify you, almighty Father, because you have formed throughout the world a holy people for your own possession, a royal priesthood, a universal Church.

We praise and glorify you because you have given us your only Son Jesus Christ to be the Apostle and High Priest of our faith, and the Shepherd of our souls.



We praise and glorify you that by his death he has overcome death; and that, having ascended into heaven, he has given his gifts abundantly to your people, making some, apostles; some, prophets; some, evangelists; some, pastors and teachers; to equip them for the work of ministry and to build up his Body. And now we give you thanks that you have called this your servant to share this ministry entrusted to your Church.

**Here the bishop and priests lay their hands on the head of the ordinand, and the bishop says,**

Send down your Holy Spirit upon your servant Linda, whom we consecrate in your name to the office and work of a priest in the Church.

Almighty Father, give to this your servant grace and power to fulfil her ministry among the people committed to her charge; to watch over them and care for them; to absolve and bless them in your name; and to proclaim the gospel of your salvation. Set her among your people to offer spiritual sacrifices acceptable in your sight, and as you have called her to your service, make her by the gift of your Holy Spirit worthy of her calling. Give her wisdom and discipline to work faithfully with all her fellow servants in Christ, that the world may come to know your glory and your love.

Accept our prayers, most merciful Father, through your Son Jesus Christ our Lord, to whom, with you and your Holy Spirit, belong glory and honour, worship and praise, now and forever.

**People Amen.**

**The new priest is now vested according to the order of priests. The bishop hands a Bible and a chalice and paten to the new priest, saying,**

Receive this Bible and this chalice and paten as signs of the authority given you to preach the word of God and to administer his holy sacraments. Do not forget the trust committed to you as a priest of the Church of God.

***The bishop presents the new priest to the congregation.***

## **Installation of Pastoral Elders**

**Archbishop Lynne** My brothers and sisters in Christ, after prayerful consideration, and according to the practice of the Territory of the People, the Pastoral Elders and the Bishop have chosen Ernie Michell, Pauline Michell

and Ursula Drynock to serve throughout the Territory as Pastoral Elders. This is a special ministry that serves to help the whole of the Territory to make wise decisions to help us walk together in good relationship with all the Creator's people.

They also serve to help the people and the local clergy to comfort, uphold and sustain the Indigenous peoples of our communities. These are not easy tasks, and they each will need our support and prayers.

Let us pray for God's life-giving Spirit, that Ursula, Pauline and Ernie may fulfill the duties of pastoral elder faithfully and creatively, and the Territory of the People may be renewed and strengthened in its mission and ministry.
