The Renewal of Baptismal Vows

Bishop: Dear friends, I now invite you to reaffirm the vows made at your baptism, pledging yourselves to the service of God, each other, and the world as ministers of Christ and in the priesthood of all believers.

Do you reaffirm your renunciation of evil and renew your commitment to Jesus Christ?

People: **I do.**

Bishop: Do you believe in God the Father?

People: **I believe in God, the Father almighty,
creator of heaven and earth.**

Bishop: Do you believe in Jesus Christ, the Son of God?
People: **I believe in Jesus Christ,
his only Son, our Lord.
He was conceived by the power of the Holy Spirit
and born of the Virgin Mary.
He suffered under Pontius Pilate,
was crucified, died, and was buried.
He descended to the dead.
On the third day he rose again.
He ascended into heaven,
and is seated at the right hand of the Father.
He will come again
to judge the living and the dead.**

Bishop: Do you believe in God the Holy Spirit?
People: **I believe in the Holy Spirit,
the holy catholic Church,
the communion of saints, the forgiveness of sins,
the resurrection of the body,
and the life everlasting.**

Bishop: Will you continue in the apostles' teaching and fellowship,
in the breaking of bread, and in the prayers?
People: **I will, with God's help.**

Bishop: Will you persevere in resisting evil and, whenever you fall into sin,
repent and return to the Lord?
People: **I will, with God's help.**

Bishop: Will you proclaim by word and example the good news of God in
Christ?
People: **I will, with God's help.**

Bishop: Will you seek and serve Christ in all persons, loving your neighbour as
yourself?
People: **I will, with God's help.**

Bishop: Will you strive for justice and peace among all people, and respect the
dignity of every human being?
People: **I will, with God's help.**

Bishop: Will you strive to safeguard the integrity of God's creation, and respect, sustain and renew the life of the Earth?

People: **I will, with God's help.**

The Covenant in Ministry

The dean elect, with the parish wardens, stands before the Bishop.

The new incumbent will read the oaths and declarations which will be signed in the presence of the people.

Representatives of the congregation present symbols of the ministry of the whole People of God.

A representative presents a Bible, saying:

Kyle, hold before us the story of God's love and mercy, and, above all, the Gospel of our Saviour Christ. Be among us as a preacher of the word of God and teacher of the faith.

Dean elect: I invite you all to join with me in proclaiming the Gospel of hope and life.

People: **Amen. We have Good News to share.**

A representative present a vessel of water, saying:

Joan Lukow

Kyle, in the waters of baptism we are buried with Christ in his death. By it we share in his resurrection. Through it we are reborn by the Holy Spirit. Be among us as one who baptizes into the community of Christ.

Dean elect: I invite you to join with me in rejoicing in our baptismal life and in nurturing the community of faith.

People: **Amen. May we all grow into the full stature of Christ.**

A representative presents the oils, saying:

Shirley Boxrud

Kyle, hold before us the anointing of the Holy Spirit for wholeness of life. Be among us as reconciler and healer.

Dean elect: I invite you to join with me in the ministry of reconciliation and healing, so that through the power of God we may bring wholeness of life to all people.

People: **Amen. In forgiveness and healing we find new life.**

A representative presents a copy of the canons of the diocese, saying: JoAnn Hinter

Kyle, we look to you to work with the committees and organizations of the church, and in our community, so that our administration may serve Christ and his Gospel and not just ourselves. Be among us in wisdom and humility, in discernment and good humour.

Dean elect: I invite you all to join with me in working for the building up of Christ's Church.

People: **Amen. We are the Body of Christ.**

A representative present the keys of the church, saying: Ron Sugiyama

Kyle, we look to you to lead and encourage us to be an open, welcoming community. Accept these keys, and let the doors of this place be open to everyone.

Dean elect: I invite you all to join with me in welcoming all who would come into the fellowship of the people of God.

People: **Amen. May we greet Christ in all who come.**

A representative presents the prayer books, saying: David Lidster

Kyle, we look to you to lead us in worship, so that, in word and sacrament, we may be renewed in our life together in our Lord Jesus Christ. Receive these books and be among us as a person of prayer.

Dean elect: I invite you all to join with me, and with the whole Church, in regular and constant prayer to our God.

People: **Amen. In quietness and confidence will be our strength.**

A representative of the congregation presents bread and wine, saying: Miriam Baskin

Kyle, we look to you as one who presides at the Eucharist and shares with us and with the whole church in the breaking of the bread as a foretaste of the heavenly banquet. Be among us to break the bread and bless the cup.

Dean elect: I invite you all to join with me in making Eucharist together, in company with the church in every age.

People: **Amen. May we know the Risen Jesus in the breaking of the bread.**

The Installation of the Dean

Bishop: Kyle, will you continue to make this Cathedral Church truly a house of prayer for the use of all people, especially the Christian people of this city and Territory?

Dean elect: *I will, God being my helper.*

Bishop: Will you by diligent study and sound learning continue to make this Cathedral Church a centre and example of the liturgical, spiritual, and theological customs of the Anglican Church of Canada?

Dean elect: *I will, God being my helper.*

Bishop: Will you help further the life and witness of the Church in this Territory, both in your work and in your prayers, and diligently exhort those among whom you minister to do the same?

Dean elect: *I will, God being my helper.*

Bishop: Will you, so far as you are able, perform gladly and willingly the duties pertaining to this office which shall be required of you?

Incumbent: *I will, God being my helper.*

The Clergy of the Territory of the People stand

Bishop: Will you, the clergy of the Territory of the People, support Kyle, your brother in ministry as your Dean?

Clergy: *We will, God being our helper.*

The people of the Cathedral stand

Bishop: Will you, members of the Cathedral Church of St. Paul's, commit yourselves to work together with Kyle in the ministry of Christ in this place?

Answer: *We will, God being our helper.*

The entire assembly stands

Bishop: Will you as brothers and sisters in the body of Christ, who now witness this new beginning, support and uphold Kyle in this ministry?

Answer: *We will, God being our helper*

The Bishop, taking the Dean by his left hand, shall place in the Dean's Chair

Bishop: As bishop of the Territory of the People, I install you as Dean with the rights and responsibilities belonging to that office.

May the power and presence of God be with you in all that you do.

Dean: I promise, with God's help, faithfully to discharge the duties which are committed to me.

The Dean kneels down and prays silently

Then, the people still standing, the Dean prays aloud

O Lord my God, I am not worthy to have you come under my roof;
yet you have called your servant to stand in your house,
and to serve at your altar.

To you and your service I devote myself, body soul and spirit.

Fill my memory with the record of your mighty works;
enlighten my understanding with the light of your Holy Spirit;
and may all the desires of my heart and will
centre in what you would have me do.

Make me an instrument of your salvation
for the people entrusted to my care,
and grant that I may faithfully administer your holy Sacraments,
and by my life and teaching set forth your true Word.

Be always quick with me in carrying out the duties of my office.

In prayer, quicken my devotion;

in praises, heighten my love and gratitude;

and grant that, by the clearness and brightness of your holy Word,
all the world may be drawn into your blessed kingdom.

All this I ask for the sake of your Son, our Saviour Jesus Christ. Amen.

*The Dean rises and, accompanied by the Bishop,
moves to stand before the assembly.*
