He was born in Turkey around 280 AD. St. Nicholas entered North American popular culture in the late 1700's, and then in 1822, Anglican Priest, Clement Moore wrote a poem with the opening line: "Twas the Night Before Christmas." The poem depicted Santa Claus as a jolly man who flies from home to home on a sled driven by reindeer to deliver toys. Shortly after that the iconic version of Santa Claus as a jolly man in red with a white beard and a sack of toys became a world-wide tradition.
