St. Paul's Prayer Partners gather in the Narthex, at the back of the church at the 10:00 am worship each Sunday during communion, and are there to provide prayer support for anyone seeking prayers for themselves and/or prayers for someone else. Many of us come to church with concerns and prayers on our heart either for others, or ourselves, and may add a name or two to the prayer bowl.

We are a people of prayer. Prayer is central to our community life together, whether we pray alone, or with others, intentionally or spontaneously, prayer is our connection to God and each other with Jesus as our intermediary.

If you ever ask yourself: "should I go and ask for prayers with the prayer partners?" you have already begun to pray... why not take that next small step to the narthex, sit with the prayer team, in a quiet and confidential setting, and ask them to pray with you?
