As Alongside Hope continues its journey of Living into Right Relationships, please join us for an eight-week online Storytelling Study on the Seven Sacred Teachings.

Each session will last one hour and all sessions will take place on Mondays apart from Victoria Day when it will move to Tuesday, May 19, also at 4 p.m. PST.

Joy Gothard, Territory Representative for Alongside Hope, will be hosting the first session on May 4 at 4 p.m. at St. Paul's Cathedral, Kamloops.

The study will be led by the Rev. Vincent Solomon, a member of Norway House Cree Nation, an Anglican priest and Indigenous Ministry Developer for the Diocese of Rupert's Land. In that role he also is the priest and pastoral leader to Epiphany Indigenous Anglican Church in Winnipeg. Vincent also serves as the Elder-in-Residence and a sessional teacher at Canadian Mennonite University and is currently a member of the Anglican Council of Indigenous Peoples (ACIP).

While this is not a “book” study, Solomon will be referencing as background, *The Seven Generations and the Seven Grandfather Teachings* by James Vukelich Kaagegaabaw, **available at your local library**, bookstore, and online including through Audible Canada.
